1920's Politics

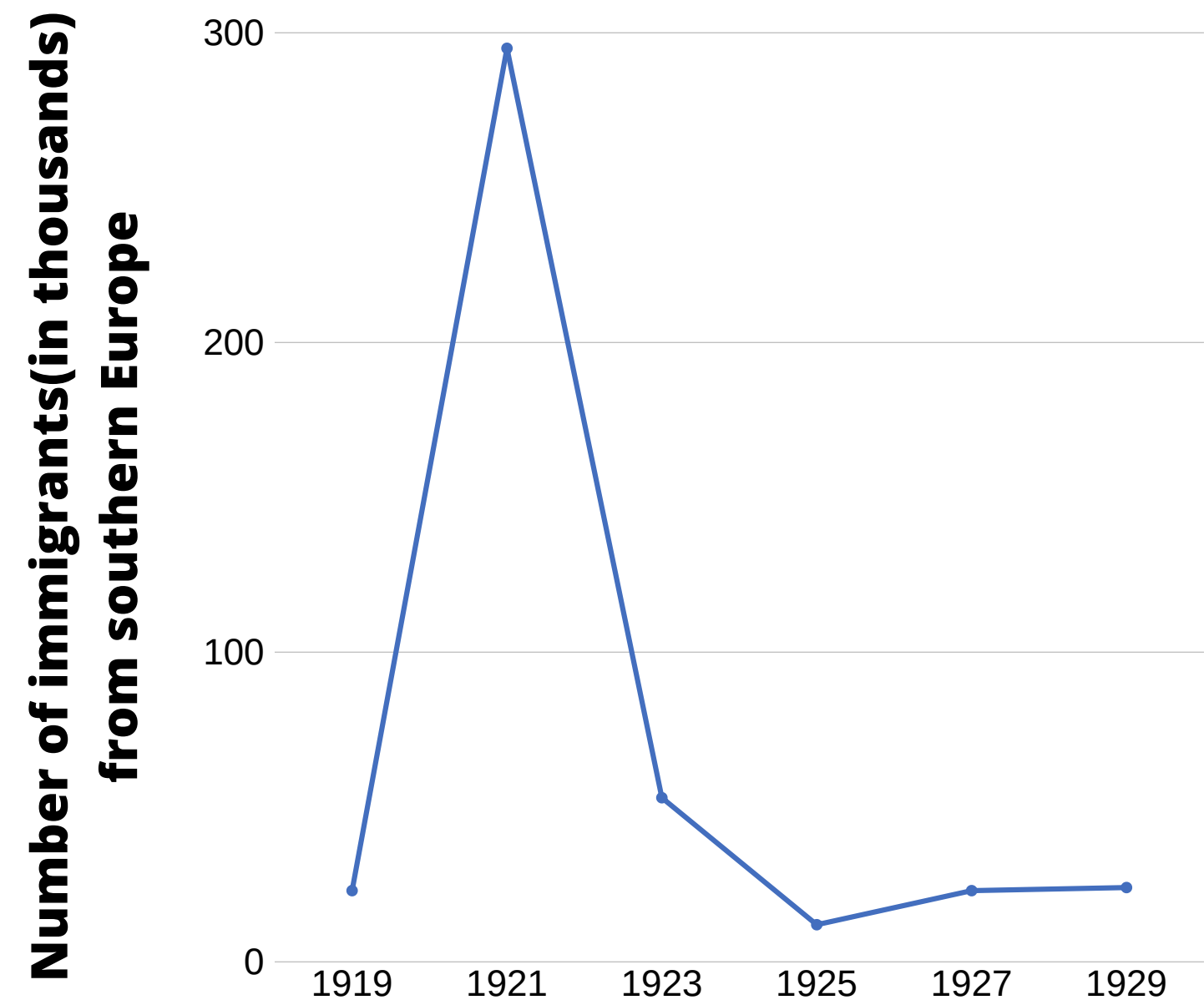
